Position Summary

The Center for Learning, Teaching and Research (CLTR) and Information Technology Services (ITS) Learning & Applied Innovation group are seeking motivated students to join the GenAl Explorers pilot project for Fall 2024. As a GenAl Explorer, you will be at the forefront of investigating the emerging role of generative Al (GenAl) in education, focusing on its potential to support and enhance student learning.

Each week as you participate in the pilot you will work independently to explore generative Al tools, and also meet with staff and collaborate with other students to better understand how these tools might be used in various ways to support education at Colgate. Participants are expected to actively engage in weekly in-person meetings, sharing findings with others and helping to direct the focus of the group's inquiry. Group conversations and explorations will be guided by guestions such as:

- What perspectives do students have about GenAl technologies in general, and how do these shape adoption / use?
- What do students see as compelling uses of GenAl to support their learning?
- How and why do students explore and experiment with GenAl tools?
- What uses of GenAl tools do students identify as valuable in their coursework?

Key Responsibilities

- Actively explore and experiment with various GenAl tools and applications in educational contexts
- Assess and document personal experiences using GenAl for learning support
- Participate in regular discussions and collaborative sessions with fellow Explorers and staff members
- Engage in ongoing reflection and critical analysis of GenAl's impact on learning processes

- Ability to think critically and approach new technologies with both skepticism and enthusiasm
- Willingness to learn and adapt to new tools and methodologies
